

The Hancock Public Schools District recently began a renovation of the main entrance to Hancock Central High School. While implementing much-needed repairs, this project also offers a unique opportunity.

We want you to be a part of this exciting project. The artist's rendering above depicts the finished product which includes a semi-circular, paved sitting area. The focal point is a boulder topped by a Hancock Bulldog statue created by an HCH student. The bricks paving the sitting area can be personalized and are available for purchase by alumni and friends.

Funds raised by this project support improvements to the High School/Middle School Commons



Area. The Commons Area is the showcase of our district, hosting sporting events, plays, awards ceremonies, reunions, and proms, to name a few. To recognize and celebrate HCH alumni, an 80" monitor will be installed near the entrance to the Sylvia J. Eskola Auditorium that will feature alumni stories. The Hancock Bulldog Paver Gift Form includes space to share a memory, photo, and short bio, should you choose. It gives all of us an opportunity to share the history of our school community with current students and returning

alumni. This is the Hancock Public Schools' legacy – stories that will inspire our students today and in the future as they pursue their dreams beyond high school.

During the school day, the Commons Area is a space for students to gather. Our goal is to add comfortable, inviting seating areas, and to create stations for students group work. Computer monitors will be mounted on the columns next to each workstation. Students can plug in their laptops, so that the entire group can see each aspect of their group work easily and clearly.





Here are the particulars:

- Pavers measure 4" by 8" with room for three lines of text.
- Each line is limited to 13 characters (including spaces) for name, graduation year, and/or a message to current and future visitors to the school district.
- The price per paver is \$200 payable by check or credit card (on-line donation only). See details on the enclosed Hancock Bulldog Paver Gift Form.
- This round of paver purchases is open until August 1, 2021. The first section of pavers will be engraved and installed by August 31.
